## MARKET STEER RULES

1. Bedding will be provided for all beef exhibits.
2. All blocking chutes will be placed in the area provided and assigned by the Superintendent.
3. Steer classes will be divided according to breed and weight, depending on the number of entries.
4. The Steer Show is a “no fit” show. “No fit,” at the Kansas Junior Livestock Show, is defined as using no adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products.
5. Each exhibitor must groom his or her own animal and may use only the assistance of an immediate family member (mother, father, legal guardian, brother, or sister) or of another 4-H or FFA member who is an exhibitor at the current year’s show. Please see the General Rules section titled “Grooming” for more information.
6. Anyone wishing to report unauthorized people grooming animals must sign a complaint form at the Show Office (Sheep/Swine barn) that includes the name of the owner, animal tag number, time, and date of the observation. A committee appointed by the Board will take action. Please see the General Rules section titled “Protest” if you wish to seek further information on submitting a formal Protest.
7. A completed nomination form and DNA envelope must have been postmarked by May 1 of the current show year.

8. **All steers must be registered in the exhibitor's name no later than June 15 of the current show year.** Registration will be determined according to each breed association's guidelines. Date of ownership is not necessarily the same as date of registration. All registered steers must be identified with a permanent tattoo corresponding with registration papers. Official registration papers must accompany all steers at check-in on Friday.
9. **Minimum weight for steers is 1,100 pounds.** There is no maximum weight limit. There is no official weigh-in of market steers. Official scales will be available for exhibitors to use in determining weight for entry.
10. Upon completion of showing in each class or division, the show superintendent reserves the right to weigh any steer. If a steer has gained or lost more than five percent (5%) from the official weight submitted by the exhibitor, the steer will be disqualified from the show.
11. Steer check-in will be Friday, from 3 - 5:30 PM in the Prairie Pavilion. **Cattle are needed to scan EID tags.** Exhibitors should also bring their weight declaration and registration papers to check-in.
12. All exhibitors of market steers must give their intent to either sell at the base bid or take their animals home. If exhibitors wish to sell at the base bid, official paperwork must be completed before the exhibitor leaves the steer show.
13. Steers must have registration papers at the show, or they will show in the crossbred class.
14. An overall Top 5 steers will be selected.

#### **DIVISION - ANGUS STEERS**

Angus steers must meet registration requirements as defined by the American Angus Association (AAA) and be registered with the AAA.

#### **DIVISION - CHAROLAIS STEERS**

1. A steer registration certificate of exhibitor ownership is required from the American International Charolais Association (AICA). The registration certificate must state at least 50% Charolais parentage.

#### **DIVISION - CHIANINA STEERS**

1. Chianina steers must meet registration requirements as defined by the American Chianina Association (ACA), be registered with ACA and have a legible tattoo corresponding to the registration papers.

#### **DIVISION - HEREFORD STEERS**

1. Hereford steers must meet registration requirements as defined by the American

Hereford Association (AHA) and be registered with the AHA.

2. The Kansas Hereford Association reserves the right to select DNA samples from the Grand and Reserve Champion Steer.

#### **DIVISION - MAINE-ANJOU STEERS**

1. Maine-Anjou steers must be 1/4 or higher Maine-Anjou and registered with the American Maine-Anjou Association.

#### **DIVISION - SHORTHORN STEERS**

1. Shorthorn steers must meet American Shorthorn Association (ASA) registration requirements and have a purebred (red) registration certificate.
2. A special class of Shorthorn and Shorthorn Plus steers, purchased in the club calf sale the previous year will be shown. The Kansas Shorthorn Association will make awards to the exhibitors of the highest placing futurity steers in both the Shorthorn and Shorthorn Plus Divisions. The Shorthorn Futurity steer show back will be held Friday at 7 PM in the Prairie Pavilion. One half of the money will be awarded in cash and half in a certificate, dated for two years, and to be used for the KLF/Shorthorn Club Calf Sale.

#### **DIVISION- SHORTHORN PLUS STEERS**

1. Shorthorn Plus steers must be 25% or greater Shorthorn and have an American Shorthorn Association Plus (green) registration certificate.

#### **DIVISION - SIMMENTAL STEERS**

1. Simmental steers must be at least 50% Simmental and have an American Simmental Association registration paper.

#### **DIVISION - ALL OTHER BREEDS (AOB)**

1. AOB Steers must meet registration requirements of the respective breed association under which they are registered.

## BREEDING HEIFER RULES

1. Bedding will be provided for all beef exhibits.
2. All blocking chutes will be placed in the area provided and assigned by the Superintendent.
3. The Heifer Show is a “no fit” show. “No fit,” at the Kansas Junior Livestock Show, is defined as using no adhesive, glue, paint, or powder products.
4. Each exhibitor must groom his or her own animal and may use only the assistance of an immediate family member (mother, father, legal guardian, brother, or sister) or of another 4-H or FFA member who is an exhibitor at the current year’s show. Please see the General Rules section titled “Grooming” for more information.
5. Anyone wishing to report unauthorized people grooming animals must sign a complaint form at the Show Office (Sheep/Swine barn) that includes the name of the owner, animal tag number, time, and date of the observation. A committee appointed by the Board will take action. Please see the General Rules section titled “Protest” if you wish to seek further information on submitting a formal Protest.
6. No official health certificate required.
7. All heifers must be registered in the exhibitor's name no later than June 15 of the

**current show year.** Registration will be determined according to each breed association's guidelines. Date of ownership is not necessarily the same as date of registration. All registered heifers must be identified with a permanent tattoo corresponding with registration papers. Official registration papers must accompany all breeding heifers at check-in on Friday.

8. All heifers must be born on or after January 1, of the prior calendar year of the show, and no later than December 31, of the prior calendar year of the show.
9. All commercial breeding heifers must be nominated by June 15 of the current show year.
10. Bred and Owned heifers must have registration papers that state the exhibitor is both the owner and the breeder of the heifer. No commercial heifers will be shown in the Bred and Owned division.
11. Heifer Check in will be Friday, from 3:00 - 5:30 PM in the Prairie Pavilion. No registered heifers are required at check-in. Registration papers for registered heifers must be brought to check-in. Show superintendent reserves the right to check any heifer to confirm tattoos match registration papers.
12. Commercial heifers must come to check-in to have EID tags scanned.
13. All breeding heifers will be released immediately following the last Heifer Show class.
14. An overall Top 5 heifers will be selected. After selection of the Top 5 heifers, the Top 5 Bred & Owned heifers will be selected.

#### **DIVISION - ANGUS HEIFERS**

1. To be eligible to show, heifers in the Angus Division must have official registration papers and corresponding tattoo.

#### **DIVISION - CHAROLAIS HEIFERS**

1. Charolais heifers must be purebred. Exhibitors are required to present registration papers at check-in.

#### **DIVISION - PERCENTAGE CHAROLAIS HEIFERS**

1. Percentage heifers must be composed of at least 50% and no more than 15/16 Charolais Percentage. Heifers must have a certificate of registration with the American International Charolais Association (AICA).

#### **DIVISION - CHIANINA HEIFERS**

1. Chianina heifers must meet registration requirements as defined by the American Chianina Association, be registered with ACA and have a legible tattoo

corresponding to the registration papers.

#### **DIVISION - HEREFORD HEIFERS**

1. The Kansas Hereford Association reserves the right to select DNA samples from the Grand and Reserve Champion Heifer.

#### **DIVISION - LIMOUSIN HEIFERS**

1. Limousin Heifers must be registered Limousin or Lim-Flex heifers (minimum 25% Limousin) (Orange NALF registration papers).

#### **DIVISION - MAINE-ANJOU HEIFER**

1. Maine-Anjou heifers must be 3/4 or more Maine-Anjou and recorded in the exhibitor's name with the American Maine-Anjou Association.

#### **DIVISION - MAINETAINER HEIFER**

1. Maintainer heifers must be 1/4 or more Maine-Anjou and recorded in the exhibitor's name with the American Maine-Anjou Association.

#### **DIVISION - RED ANGUS HEIFERS**

1. Purebred Red Angus females must be registered with the Red Angus Association of America and meet all requirements for Category 1A or 1B.

#### **DIVISION – SHORTHORN HEIFERS**

1. Shorthorn females must present (red) registration certificate with 93% or higher Shorthorn blood from the American Shorthorn Association.
2. A special class of Shorthorn & Shorthorn Plus heifers, purchased in the club calf sale the previous year will be shown. The Kansas Shorthorn Association will make awards to the exhibitors of the highest placing futurity heifers in both the Shorthorn and Shorthorn Plus Divisions. The Shorthorn Futurity heifer show back will be held Friday at 7:00 PM in the Prairie Pavilion. One half of the money will be awarded in cash and half in a certificate, dated for two years, and to be used for the KLF/Shorthorn Club Calf Sale.

#### **DIVISION – SHORTHORN PLUS HEIFERS**

1. Shorthorn Plus females must present (green) registration certificate stating 50%-92% Shorthorn blood from the American Shorthorn Association.

#### **DIVISION – SIMMENTAL HEIFERS**

1. Simmental heifers must be 76% or greater Simmental and registered in the membership for which the exhibitor is an authorized representative.

#### **DIVISION - PERCENTAGE SIMMENTAL HEIFERS**

1. Heifers must be at least 1/2 to 3/4 Simmental blood. They must be registered with

the American Simmental Association.

**DIVISION - ALL OTHER BREEDS (AOB) HEIFERS**

1. AOB Heifers must meet registration requirements of the respective breed association under which they are registered. They must have a legible tattoo corresponding to the registration paper.

**DIVISION - COMMERCIAL HEIFERS**

1. Commercial heifers must be nominated by June 15<sup>th</sup> of the current show year and have a corresponding EID tag.
